





- All calls can be found in the Participant Portal
- Each call gives you specific information on the questions that are to be addressed in a proposal
- Make sure your proposal fully fits the call description and topics within the Work Programme







- After a clear formulation of the project idea, a matching exercise with the potential open or forthcoming selected topic needs to be executed from your side.
 - Does your idea have a significant impact (almost) identical to the expected impact of the topic?
 - Does your idea tackle the challenge described in the topic description?
 - Actions foreseen from your side are similar to the ones described in the topic? Do you have a common understanding in terms of costs and time with the topic?










3. Topics flagged for International Cooperation?





How to identify topics flagged for International Cooperation?

- In some cases, topics in the Work Programme encourage
 International Cooperation and state explicitly that 'this will be positively considered during the evaluation of proposals'.
- International Cooperation is a cross-cutting priority and included in almost all parts of Horizon 2020
- All flagged topics are defined as such in the Participant Portal

International cooperation "Open to the world"

Horizon 2020 is **Open to the World**. This means that participants from all over the world, regardless of their placestablishment or residence, can participate in most of the calls of Horizon 2020. Furthermore, in many cases, the fund at least partly the participation of the international partners (see below).

Encouraging International Cooperation

In addition to this general openness of most Horizon 2020 calls to non-EU researchers, many calls particularly encourage cooperation with non-EU partners. All calls are published in bi-annual "Work Programmes" and can be in the International cooperation topic page.



 Programme: list of countries, eligibility and admissibility conditions, evaluation criteria and procedure, scoring and thresholds, etc.
- Submission forms and templates: essential forms and guides to draw up and submit your proposal
- Guide to the submission and evaluation process



National Contact Points

- The network of National Contact Points (NCPs) is the main structure to provide guidance, practical information and assistance on all aspects of participation in Horizon 2020.
- NCPs are also established in many non-EU and nonassociated countries ("third partner countries").
- NCPs give personalised support on the spot and in applicants' own languages.
- Organise workshops and information events
- Established, operated and financed by EU Member States, associated countries and third countries
- Nominated by national ministries to the European Commission


